How to Recognize a Phone Scam

Phone scams come in many forms. But they tend to make certain promises and threats or ask you to pay certain ways. Here's what to know:

There is no prize. The caller might say you were "selected" or that you have won something. But if you have to pay to get the prize, it's not a prize.

You won't Be Arrested. Scammers pretend to be law enforcement or a federal agency. They will threaten arrest, a fine, or deportation, if you don't pay taxes or a fine. Their goal is to scare you. Real law enforcement and federal agencies won't call and threaten you.

You Don't need to Decide Now. An honest business will give you time to think an offer over and get written information before you commit. Don't get pressured into making a decision on the spot.

Only Scammers demand that you pay certain ways. Scammers will demand you pay in a way that makes it hard to get your money back- wire transfer, gift card, cryptocurrency or payment app. Anyone insisting on these payment methods is a scammer.

Government agencies won't call to confirm your sensitive information. NO agency will call out of the blue for sensitive information. They are lying if they say they're with an agency you know like the FTC.

You shouldn't be getting all those calls. If a company is selling something, it needs your written permission to call you with a robocall. And if you are on the DO NOT CALL REGISTRY, you should not get live calls from companies you haven't done business with before. Those calls are illegal. If someone is already breaking the law calling you, what they are calling about is probably a scam.

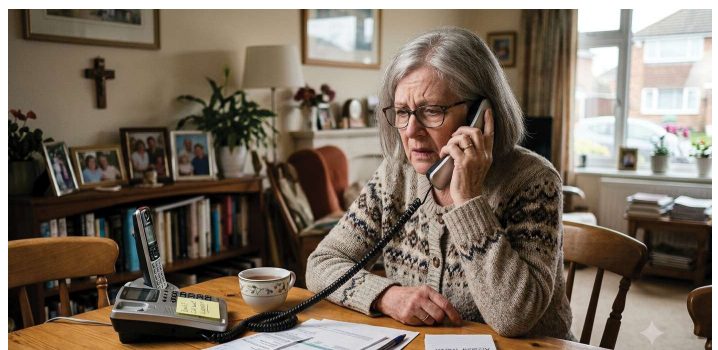

PET FINDER REPORT

We had two pet escapees this month, and I'm happy to report that both were quickly and safely returned home. In both cases, the pets had microchips, which made reunification much faster and easier.

This is a great reminder to make sure your pets are microchipped and that your contact information is current and registered with the microchip company. A microchip is only effective if the information attached to it is up to date.

As we head into August, please remember that South Texas heat can become dangerous very quickly for both people and pets. Even healthy animals can suffer from heat exhaustion or heat stroke in a matter of minutes.

Signs of Heat Exhaustion in Dogs

- Excessive panting or rapid breathing
- Drooling more than normal
- Bright red, pale, or bluish gums
- Weakness or lethargy
- Vomiting or diarrhea
- Staggering, stumbling, or loss of coordination
- Confusion or disorientation
- Collapse or unconsciousness

If your dog shows these symptoms:

- Move your pet to a cool, shaded area immediately.
- Offer cool (not ice-cold) water.
- Place cool, wet towels on the neck, chest, belly, and paws.
- Contact your veterinarian or an emergency animal hospital right away.

The safest times to walk dogs during the summer are early morning before 9:00 a.m. and after sunset when temperatures and pavement surfaces are cooler. Remember, if the pavement is too hot for your bare hand for seven seconds, it is too hot for your pet's paws. It is also against Texas law to leave an animal outdoors without adequate shade and fresh water, or to leave an animal unattended in a vehicle where it could be endangered by heat.

As always, if you need assistance with pet registration, microchip scanning, or identifying a found pet, I am happy to help. Working together, we can keep our neighborhood pets safe and get them home quickly when they wander.

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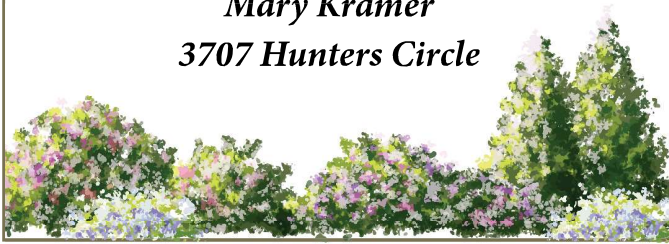

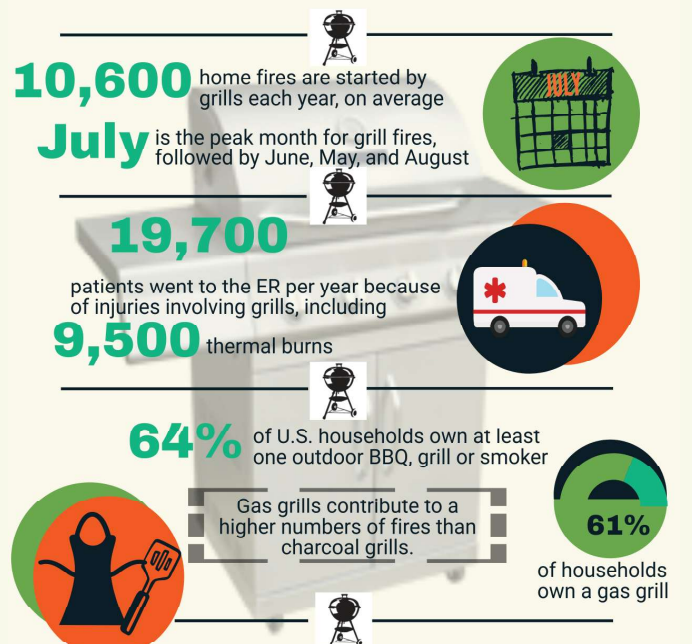

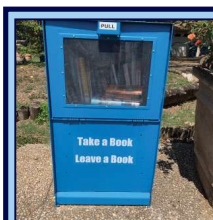

Homemade Lemonade Recipe

- 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ cups white sugar
- 1 cup water
- 9 medium lemons, or more as needed
- 7 cups ice-cold water
- ice as needed



Step 1: Gather all ingredients.

Step 2: Combine sugar and 1 cup water in a small saucepan. Stir to dissolve sugar while mixture comes to a boil. Set aside to cool slightly.

Step 3: Meanwhile, roll lemons around on your counter to soften. Cut in half crosswise, and squeeze into a liquid measuring cup. Add pulp to the juice, but discard any seeds. Continue juicing until you have 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups fresh juice and pulp

Step 4: Pour 7 cups ice-cold water into a pitcher. Stir in lemon juice and pulp, then add simple syrup to taste. Add ice and enjoy!

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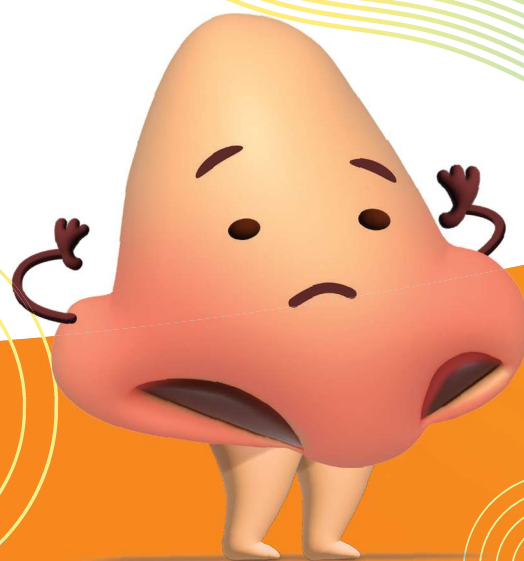


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
